A team of Senior members reached out various far-flung villages of Jammu Province Ratti, Sarai, and Barmini and after interacting there with the villagers they came to know that their mean occupation is daily laboring, some families are widow headed and living their tough life and are facing hardships in continuing the education of their children. Even at the distance of 3 to 4 kilometers medical sub-centers are not available. Keeping all these points in consideration the Chairman HAS assured the villagers that they will discuss their grievance with the core team of Human Aid society besides them they will try to convince its funding agencies to work in these far-flung villages and preferably will motivate them to focus on women empowerment in said places.
