Introduction

Human Aid Society continued its humanitarian and community-oriented work throughout July 2026, focusing on supporting vulnerable and underprivileged families, empowering beneficiaries through livelihood initiatives, promoting social harmony and civic responsibility, and strengthening collaboration with government departments, civil society organizations and humanitarian partners.

1. Marriage Assistance

4th July 20026-Human Aid Society provided essential wedding assistance to the daughter of an underprivileged and deserving family at its Head Office. The assistance included food items, clothing and essential bridal accessories, helping reduce the financial burden on her father and enabling the family to arrange the wedding with dignity. The beneficiary family expressed sincere gratitude for the Society's timely humanitarian support.

2. Four-Day Exposure Visit of Human Aid Society Delegation to Ladakh

6–9th July 2026- A 12-member senior delegation of Human Aid Society, led by the Chairman and comprising the Vice Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary and other senior members, completed a four-day exposure visit to Ladakh to study its history, culture, religious harmony, education, administration, tourism, environmental practices and civic discipline. The delegation visited the Kargil War Memorial, paid tribute to the martyrs of the 1999 Kargil War, toured the gallery and interacted with the Lieutenant Colonel in charge, with the Chairman also offering constructive suggestions. The delegation appreciated the Government of India's connectivity initiatives, including the Sona Marg and Zojila Tunnels, and observed the organized movement of essential supplies to Ladakh ahead of winter.







Leh, the delegation visited Leh Jama Masjid, Shah-e-Hamdan Mosque at Shey and Shey Palace, along with monasteries and other places of worship, gaining insight into Ladakh's history, Muslim heritage and traditions of religious harmony and peaceful coexistence. At Pangong Lake, members interacted with tourists and local residents regarding tourism, facilities, culture and the local economy. They also visited Imamia Public School and interacted with civil society members, the Bar Association, hotel owners, Kashmiri traders, local employees and medical experts. The delegation particularly appreciated Ladakh's cleanliness, environmental awareness, civic discipline and measures against electricity theft. The Chairman emphasized that Jammu & Kashmir could learn from Ladakh's government-public cooperation in these areas. On the return journey, the delegation visited Baltal to review arrangements for the Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra. The Chairman stated that the Society would continue such exposure and awareness programmes. All participating members bore their own expenses.

3. Relationships Go Beyond Positions; Sincerity Keeps Them Alive

18th July- Former GOC, Lieutenant General (Retd.) R. P. Kalita, visited Baramulla on a private visit and was warmly welcomed by Human Aid Society Chairman Bashir Ahmad Mir, friends and well-wishers.

During his tenure, Lt. Gen. (Retd.) Kalita supported youth sports, cultural and welfare activities and extended valuable assistance to Human Aid Society for orphaned and underprivileged children through counselling and essential support.

The gathering was attended by Major General Manoj Joshi, VSM, GOC 19 Infantry Division, prominent citizens, social workers and media representatives. The Chairman highlighted that relationships built on sincerity, trust and mutual respect continue beyond official positions. The programme concluded in a warm atmosphere with a reaffirmation of commitment to goodwill, social harmony and humanitarian values.



4. Seventh Monthly Grocery Support Instalment for Widows.

22th July -Human Aid Society, with the support of Muslim Aid Australia (MAA), distributed the seventh monthly grocery instalment to nearly 100 deserving widows under the 2026 Monthly Grocery Support Project at its Head Office, Dewan Bagh, Baramulla.



The project provides regular essential food items to widows facing financial hardship. MAA, in collaboration with Human Aid Society, is also supporting Ramadan Food Assistance, Winter Relief and other welfare programmes for widows, orphans and underprivileged families across Jammu & Kashmir. Beneficiaries expressed gratitude for the continued assistance, while members of the public appreciated the joint humanitarian initiative.

5. SKY Trust Felicitation Ceremony

25th July 2026- MNGO Desk- SKY Trust organized a felicitation ceremony at Pattan, honouring 16 Fellows and awarding certificates to 17 artisans who completed skill-development training. The programme was attended by officials, distinguished guests and social workers, including mother NGO Human Aid Society Chairman Bashir Ahmad Mir and former Human Aid Society Secretary Naseer Ahmad Rather. SKY Trust Chairperson Ms. Zahida highlighted the organization's work, particularly in mental health. Fellows and artisans shared their experiences and the positive impact of the programme. Speakers appreciated the initiative and emphasized the importance of mental well-being, counselling, skill development and guiding youth towards positive and productive lives.



6. Emergency Executive Meeting- 27th July

An emergency meeting of the Human Aid Society Executive Committee was convened by the Chairman at the Society's Head Office, Dewan Bagh, Baramulla, from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM, with Executive Committee members, the Patron and former Secretary in attendance.

The meeting reviewed the Society's FCRA registration process, including verification, compliance requirements, submitted responses and further necessary action.



The Committee also reviewed collaboration with a USA-based funding agency for a livelihood project aimed at creating employment opportunities for unemployed youth. As financial assistance for immediate implementation had already been received, members discussed vendor selection, procurement and payment procedures.

The approved vendor was briefed on project requirements and directed to supply quality livestock on time at competitive prices. The Committee also reviewed ongoing programmes.

A unanimous resolution, signed by all members present, authorized procurement of project materials, release of payment to the approved vendor and immediate commencement of the livelihood project. The Chairman thanked all Executive members at the conclusion of the meeting.

7. 29th July- Review of Women's Empowerment Mini Poultry Units IDS Project

Human Aid Society held an emergency review meeting of the Mini Poultry Units Project, launched in May 2026 in collaboration with IDS to economically empower women affected by Operation Sindhoor, under which approximately 20 mini poultry units were provided.



The meeting reviewed the project's progress and a recent viral disease outbreak among poultry birds caused by extreme summer heat. The Society promptly informed the Government Animal Husbandry Department, Baramulla, which deputed veterinary doctors to inspect the units, diagnose the disease, provide medicines and vaccinations, technical guidance and conduct post-mortems of deceased birds.

All unit holders were subsequently called to the Society's Head Office, where poultry experts and supplier representatives reviewed the losses and possible causes and provided refresher training on poultry management, biosecurity, hygiene and disease prevention.

The Society also extended special support to a 15-year-old orphan girl responsible for her younger siblings after several of her birds died, assuring her of additional birds to restore her unit and livelihood. Beneficiaries expressed gratitude for the Society's timely intervention and continued support, while the Chairman expressed confidence that continued guidance would ensure the project's sustainability and improve the beneficiaries' economic well-being.

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
