

REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER -2025**Human Aid Society Reaches 1,000 Families Across J&K Under MAA Winter Aid Programme**

Human Aid Society successfully implemented its Winter Aid Assistance Programme (MAA) across seven districts of Jammu & Kashmir, benefiting 1,000 vulnerable families. The programme was inaugurated in Srinagar on 7th December 2025 and concluded at Makka Masjid, Jammu on 25th December 2025, with full financial support from Muslim Aid Australia (MAA).





The programme was inaugurated at Durbal Bemina, Budgam, by **SSP Jammu and Kashmir Police Ms. Raja Nighat Aman**, who appreciated the organisation's transparency, disciplined distribution system, and accountability, and encouraged public support for genuine humanitarian initiatives. Winter clothing, blankets, food kits, and essential items were distributed to widows, orphans, physically challenged persons, elderly and the poorest of poor families across Srinagar, Budgam, Kupwara, Bandipora, Ganderbal, Baramulla, and Jammu.

On 9th December 2025, a distribution programme in Kupwara provided 186 winter relief and food kits. The **Additional Deputy Commissioner, Kupwara**, praised Human Aid Society's transparent working style and stated that the administration was highly impressed, adding that he would recommend adopting similar welfare models within government programmes.

On 12th December 2025, Human Aid Society, in collaboration with Shahlat Foundation, organised an Anti-Drug Awareness Programme at Dream Land Public School, Ganderbal. **DYSP J&K Police Mr. Mohammad Altaf Khan** stressed parental vigilance and community cooperation to curb drug abuse. On the same occasion, 54 vulnerable families received winter clothing and food assistance with support from Muslim Aid Australia.



On 18th December 2025, at Baramulla District Headquarters, **Deputy Commissioner Mr. Minga Sherpa** lauded Human Aid Society's 27 years of humanitarian service and its non-discriminatory approach.

During this phase, 900 food kits were distributed across Kashmir districts, including 150 winter aid kits in Baramulla.



The programme concluded on 25th December 2025 in Jammu alongside a one-day seminar titled **“We and Our Responsibilities”**, organised in collaboration with the Islamic Research & Development Trust (Makka Masjid). **Hon’ble MLA Jammu East Mr. Vikramjeet Randhawa** emphasized collective responsibility, peace, and social harmony, assuring full support for humanitarian work.





Addressing the seminar, Chairman, Human Aid Society, highlighted the organisation's journey and underscored the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) on neighbours' rights, also recalling former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee's vision of inclusive nation-building. At the conclusion, winter relief and food assistance were distributed among 92 widows and extremely poor beneficiaries from Hindu, Muslim, and Kashmiri Pandit communities.
