Mr Mohamad Azharudin - Former Indian Cricket team captain graced the Human Aid Society event at Baramulla.

08th Sept 2025: Legendary former Indian cricket captain and globally renowned batsman Mr. Mohammad Azharuddin visited Baramulla today to participate in a Cricket Coaching and Batting Skills Camp organized by Human Aid Society in collaboration with the Indian Army and District Sports Council. The camp was expertly conducted under the supervision of renowned sports physician Dr. Aijaz Ashai.



Before arriving at the stadium, Mr. Azharuddin paid tribute at the Khawaja Bagh Memorial, honouring the martyrs who laid down their lives in the service of the Nation. He also met with officers and personnel of the 46 RR and 19 Artillery Division, praising their dedication and service.



At General Bipan Rawath Stadium, Baramulla, Mr. Azharuddin received a grand welcome from the public, youth cricketers, and local cricket enthusiasts. He was personally greeted by distinguished guests:

Human Aid Society, in Collaboration with Muslim Aid Australia (MAA) Launches Monthly Grocery Support Program for Widows

23rd Sept 2025: Human Aid Society, with the financial support of its long-term international funding partner Muslim Aid Australia (MAA), has launched its Monthly Grocery Support Program aimed at assisting 100 widows for one full year (August 2025 – July 2026).

The inaugural program was held at Human Aid Society's Central Office, Baramulla, where the beneficiaries, identified from District Baramulla and adjoining areas, were selected so they could conveniently collect their monthly grocery kits throughout the year.



Although the program commenced later than scheduled due to delays in fund transfer, the inaugural distribution successfully provided 46 widows with essential grocery items along with 2 kgs of roasted frozen chicken each, ensuring that their children could enjoy nutritious and tasty meals without feeling deprived compared to others.

The inauguration was attended by Human Aid Society's executive members as well as Mr. Rasiq Masood, a USA-based Kashmiri NRI from Srinagar. He appreciated the collaboration between Muslim Aid Australia and Human Aid Society Kashmir, commending the Society's commitment to transparency and accountability. On this occasion, Human Aid Society's Chairman, Patron, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and executive members also held a separate meeting with Mr. Masood, where they discussed the daily life challenges faced by the widowed beneficiaries and other needy people.

Mr. Masood further visited the Society's established Old Age Home and its Sustainable Affordable Farming Entrepreneurship Project, (SAFE) where he highly praised the initiatives and acknowledged the organisation's dedication to the welfare of marginalized communities.

This program marks an important milestone in Human Aid Society's ongoing mission to improve the living conditions of widows, orphans, and underprivileged families across Jammu & Kashmir.
