Rehabilitation is the only solution to empower the downtrodden people.

3rd Jan 2024: On new year beginning, HAS provided opportunity to another 30 needy unemployed poor Women to earn their dignified livelihood.

In continuation to women empowerment programme under its VTEDS Project of SGH (Self-help group) concept HAS established two more skill centres at Khalsa Colony Sunjwan road Jammu and in Dawaran, a far-flung village of Tehsil Uri in collaboration with Kashmir Development Foundation, a UK based organisation.

Today the Khalsa Colony Jammu VTEDS centre was inaugurated at 11:30 am by the worthy Chairman of organisation Mr Bashir Ah Mir along with HAS Secretary Mr Naseer Ahmad Rather and Treasurer Mr Ghulam-udin Wani.

On this occasion some reputed local citizens, parents / guardians of the beneficiaries were also present there to encourage the beneficiaries. While addressing the gathering, Chairman and Secretary briefed the audience about the aims and objectives of Human Aid Society VTEDS (Vocational Training cum Enterprise Development Scheme) as per the methodology of Self-help Group (SGH)concept.

During their interaction with the beneficiaries a well-qualified young lady from Sikh community who had got admission in the centre came forward and expressed her gratitude towards this initiative of HAS and shared her views with the HAS team and said that she had completed her higher studies (BEd) degree years back but is still jobless and facing hardships in earning the livelihood for family. She said, "I am hopeful that this centre would turn my despair into hope and enable me to earn a dignified living for myself and my children".

On this occasion an old lady who is guardian of a poor orphan girl from previous VTEDS centre (Rahimabad Bathindi Jammu) went emotional and thanked HAS & KDF-UK for giving her orphan niece this free skill training to make her selfreliant. She also thanked for giving her equipment support to start-up her business because she was unable to bear the expenses of her own.



Another skill centre of Dawaran Uri was inaugurated today at 02:00 p.m by senior Executive member of the organisation Er Mohammad Sadiq Bhat and Senior GB Member / VTEDS Program Coordinator Mr Ghulam Mohi-u-din Ganai along with HAS Officials Mr Riyaz Ah War and Mr Wahid Majeed Ganai.

After completing the inauguration, HAS Officials conduct an awareness session for the enrolled beneficiaries of Dawaran (newly established skill centre) and their parents about the benefits of various govt schemes and programmes especially the scheme VISHVAKARMA as introduced by central govt of India which is exclusively meant for Artisan Community of the nation. While briefing the schemes, Mr Riyaz Ah War (HAS official) assured the beneficiaries that he will constantly guide and help them in availing the benefits of the said scheme.

It is pertinent to mention here that the Human Aid Society in collaboration with KDF-UK had already trained 135 women during last two years and most of them had established their small business units and are living their dignified life. VTEDS Project as run by these organisations yielded good results and had given birth to many success stories.

20th Jan 2024: Emergency relief and rehabilitation team of Human Aid Society led by its senior member Er Farooq Ah Malik who was accompanied by Riyaz Ah war, Shamsuddin lone and Irfan Hamid Bhatt and Mohmad Sabir lone reached Dachi Uri, a border village of district Baramulla where recently in a terrific fire incident four houses become Ash due to electric short circuit and this fire incident make 26 souls comprising upon women and children and this giant fire forced these families to live under the bare sky during this harsh winter.

The Chairman Human Aid Society soon after receiving this heartfelt news from a renowned, social and political activist of Uri Dr Sajad Shafi and he takes serious note of this incident and requested the rehabilitation team to go to the spot and not only gave courage to these people but also does whatever cash and kind help is possible on behalf of the Human Aid Society so that these victims can have some comfort in this bitter cold. The HAS team in obeying the request of its chairman immediately rushed to the spot and distributed Bedding, blankets, daily essential commodities among the fire victims besides it the organisation distributed cash assistance of five thousand Rupees (5000) to each victim family.

He also requested other NGO organisations to come forward and help these families in this tough time.
