

**REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER -2025****Seminar on “We and Our Responsibilities”**

On an important theme, Human Aid Society organized a seminar titled “We and Our Responsibilities” on 8 November 2025 at the Conference Hall of Government Boys Degree College, Baramulla. The seminar brought together eminent, respected, and influential personalities from across North Kashmir under one roof, without any distinction of religion or community.

The primary objective of the seminar was to draw attention to the rapidly deteriorating social conditions emerging in our society. The organizers emphasized that if these issues are not addressed in time by responsible and conscious members of society, the day is not far when we will all be left merely lamenting the consequences. Through this platform, Human Aid Society made a sincere effort to awaken social consciousness and encourage timely reflection and action.

During the seminar, speakers deliberated extensively on various social evils. A collective consensus emerged that instead of fulfilling their own responsibilities, people often tend to blame others for societal shortcomings. Therefore, the need of the hour is for every individual to recognize and shoulder their own responsibilities so that a social system can be established where everyone may live with dignity, peace, and a sense of security.

The seminar was presided over by former Chairman, Public Service Commission and former Deputy Commissioner, Baramulla, Dr. Farooq Ahmad Lone, while the then Deputy Commissioner and Director General, School Education, Mr. Dr. Ghulam Nabi Itoo graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. Former Trade Union Leader, Mr. Qayoom Wani, and Superintendent of Police, JKP Baramulla, Mr. Feroz Yahya, attended the seminar as Guests of Honour.

Besides these dignitaries, several senior bureaucrats of the district, members of civil society, trader leaders, prominent educationists, and journalists were also present.

On the occasion, Human Aid Society honoured Mr. Dr. Ghulam Nabi Itoo in recognition of his exemplary public service, unwavering adherence to principles of good governance, and outstanding contributions during his tenure. On the eve of his retirement, he was felicitated with a ceremonial turban (Dastar Bandi) and presented with an Award of Appreciation.

**Strong Community Mobilisation as Human Aid Society and BSF-112 Conduct anti-Drug Seminar.**

18<sup>th</sup> Nov -2025 A seminar was organised today at Government High School Kitchama (Sheeri) under the “Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan” in joint collaboration between Human Aid Society and BSF-112.

The speakers and children shared their thoughts and experiences about drug abuse.

The Deputy Commandant of BSF 112 Battalion, Mr. Suroji Kumar, addressed the gathering and explained in detail the main objectives of the Government of India’s Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan, urging people to stay away from substance abuse.



Continuing its mission to combat drug abuse, the organisation in collaboration with BSF 112 Battalion and the Police Drug De-addiction Centre Baramulla, organised another drug awareness programme at Government Middle School Khanpora (Baramulla) on 20th November 2025. In a strong display of commitment, hundreds of students, Human Aid Society volunteers, civil society members, and BSF personnel participated in a relay march, carrying placards and spreading a powerful message against drug abuse.

Human Aid Society, highlighted that the organisation had sensed the threat of drug addiction as early as 2011 and had started spreading awareness at that time. However, society did not take the issue seriously then, and as a result, today we are facing its direct or indirect consequences. They emphasised that parents and teachers must now give special attention to their children.
