

## DECEMBER 2024-REPORT

### **India Emergency Aid / Winter Aid.**

Human Aid Society (HAS) expresses gratitude to Muslim Aid Australia (MAA) for their enduring support in providing emergency food assistance and now extending winter aid support to the most underprivileged people of Kashmir. Once again, we, the people of Kashmir, extend warm greetings to our fund partner Muslim Aid Australia (Maa) for this support. In the initial phase, Maa provided emergency food to 250 families, followed by winter aid and emergency food support for 400 families.

Human Aid Society diligently ensure a governance mechanism to guarantee the accessibility of the program to people at the last mile. We conducted a needs analysis and a thorough survey of the potential families at the margins. Families were verified through different sources, namely local keynote persons, government departments, and our local sources, by engaging local volunteers along with a dedicated staff from the Human Aid Society head office situated in Baramulla.



Human Aid Society appreciate this mutual partnership where our fund partner (Maa) considers our voices for the customization of aid items as per local feasibility. This greatly benefits the program and meets the actual needs of the Kashmiri beneficiaries covered under Maa project.



Funds for winter aid and emergency food items were received late, but we managed to distribute the items on time. We are thankful to the vendors who supported this noble cause and ensured the delivery of the items for distribution despite non-payment at the time of delivery. We are also thankful to the volunteers who extended their support to ensure the distribution of items at the doorsteps of the beneficiaries.

Some of the beneficiaries were persons with disabilities, and we feel satisfied to have covered them through this initiative. However, we also feel sad that they had to come to the distribution point to receive the aid items. Overhead expenses were higher due to the geographical limitations of Kashmir, where habitations are too scattered.



Human Aid Society also invite government functionaries to maintain transparency and spread awareness about the program. We inform the concerned department heads about the distribution and our program. The District Development Commissioner, along with the heads of the Police Department and Social Welfare Department, attended the distribution of aid items in our recently concluded programs and We are grateful to them.





The winter aid distribution process was kick started from Kupwara on 2<sup>nd</sup> Dec 2024 reached Bandipora on 5<sup>th</sup> Dec and was concluded at dak-bungalow Baramulla on 7<sup>th</sup> Dec 2024. The process benefited 400 families comprising upon 2000 souls of these three Districts of North Kashmir wherein 103 families of District Kupwara, 85 families district Bandipora and 212 Families of District Baramulla were covered and beneficiaries were benefited by food kits/ Blankets and warm unstitched Faran and kurta pajama clothing's and each winter aid kit costs near about Rupees five thousand.
