May 2026- Report

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01-05-2026: Human Aid Society Convenes Emergency Executive Meeting, Advances International Partnership and Community Development Initiatives. An emergency meeting of the Executive Body of Human Aid Society was convened on 30th April 2026 at 2 Pm at the Society's Head Office Baramulla.

The meeting was strictly restricted to Executive Body members and was called to address an urgent organizational matter. The Chairman personally intimated the members telephonically during late-night hours, requesting their presence on short notice.

The meeting was attended by the Chairman, Patron, General Secretary, Treasurer, and other executive members. The Chairman expressed his sincere gratitude to all members for their prompt response and timely participation despite the limited notice.

The primary agenda of the meeting was to deliberate upon an important organizational matter involving collaboration with a new international funding agency. The discussion included the proposed signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), submission of a tentative Qurbani Project, and future collaboration opportunities. During the meeting, the Chairman, Treasurer, and other representatives of the international funding organization joined online.

A formal introduction session was held where both organizations shared their profiles, experiences, and ongoing work, fostering mutual understanding and cooperation. The Chairman of Human Aid Society presented a detailed briefing on the organization's ongoing initiatives, future plans, and strategic priorities. The international partner appreciated the efforts and expressed agreement with the proposed plans. They assured that, subject to successful fundraising, the Human Aid Society would be given priority for collaboration, particularly in the upcoming Qurbani project and other humanitarian initiatives in the Jammu and Kashmir.

Special emphasis was placed on expanding work in key sectors such as rehabilitation, higher education support, skill development, and women empowerment, aiming to bring sustainable improvement in the lives of vulnerable communities. The funding agency acknowledged these priorities and agreed to consider them progressively in future projects.



The Chairman also briefed the members about another funding agency involved in a women empowerment program, including updates regarding the release of funds and necessary follow-up actions. Furthermore, the findings from recent field verifications conducted over the past week were shared. Several critical and distressing cases were brought to light, where immediate rehabilitation measures were required. The Society has already initiated emergency support, including providing temporary shelter to affected families. Members appreciated these efforts and expressed satisfaction. During the meeting, Mr. Er Mohammad Sadiq Bhat, Secretary of Human Aid Society, was assigned the responsibility to prepare a comprehensive proposal for emergency rehabilitation programs by utilizing his expertise and personal outreach.

The Executive Body members unanimously proposed the name of Er. Farooq Ahmad Milk, Senior member, to serve as Program Coordinator with the newly introduced international funding partner. The proposal was duly acknowledged, and the international partner subsequently inducted Mr. Er Malik into their official organizational correspondence group to facilitate effective coordination and communication.

The Chairman also highlighted the issue of a piece of land as donated by him to the organization, where encroachment concerns have increased. It was decided that a boundary wall will be constructed at the earliest to secure the property and safeguard the organization's assets.

2nd May 2026: In continuation of the decisions taken during 30th April 2026 the meeting, the Chairman and Secretary of Human Aid Society, with the assistance of concerned Revenue Department officials, successfully completed the demarcation of the donated land. The Chairman has requested the Secretary to immediately initiate the construction of the boundary wall without any further delay to protect the property from encroachment.



3rd May 2026: Human Aid Society: Bringing Hope “Where Life Was Slipping Away.”

In Tehsil Uri, a helpless bedridden patient was living with his wife and only daughter in a broken room where rainwater leaked inside, with no means for treatment. Within just 7 days, Human Aid Society turned his unsafe shelter into a livable home and arranged his monthly medical care. Work is still ongoing, and in future it will be completed into a beautiful home.

15th May 2026: “Tears, Ashes and Hope: Human Aid Society Stands With Fire Victims of Trumbgund (Hygam)”

Chairman Human Aid Society Mr Bashir Ah Mir visited Trumbgund (Hygam), Sopore, on 14th May morning after a devastating fire incident that occurred during the intervening night of 13/14 May 2026, in which three residential houses were completely gutted.

During the visit, the Chairman expressed heartfelt sympathy and solidarity with the affected families, who belong to economically weaker sections of society. Out of the three gutted households, two families belong to the Mochi (cobbler) community and earn their livelihood through manual work.



After returning from the village visit, the Chairman called all the affected families to the Human Aid Society office Baramulla and handed over cash cheques as immediate relief assistance to the victims.

The affected families highly thanked Human Aid Society for providing timely relief and appreciated the Chairman's personal visit, his words of sympathy, and the way he shared the pain and grief of the weeping families. The victims also appreciated that the Chairman fulfilled his promise without wasting any time and extended humanitarian support at a crucial moment of need. Human Aid Society also reaffirmed its commitment to continue extending every possible humanitarian support to the affected families during this difficult time

17th May 2026: From Relief to Self-Reliance: Poultry Livelihood Project Started for “Operation Sindhoor Victims”

Human Aid Society in collaboration with its international fund partner IDS, launched a Mini Poultry Pilot Project on 15th May 2026 in Tehsil Uri and Boniyar of District Baramulla, Jammu & Kashmir, under the rehabilitation program for families affected by “Operation Sindhoor.”

The project aims to support poor, widowed, and economically vulnerable families by helping them become self-reliant through sustainable poultry farming and dignified livelihood opportunities.



In the first phase, 20 deserving families were provided with poultry units including egg-laying hens, chicks, poultry feed, water pots, feeding pots, and other essential items to help them meet nutritional needs and generate a stable source of income.

Prior to the launch, field verification was conducted to identify genuine beneficiaries, while selected families also received professional training in poultry farming and management to ensure the successful running of the units. The project has initially been launched on a pilot basis, and more deserving families are expected to be included in the coming phases to expand rehabilitation and livelihood opportunities in the affected areas.

22nd May 2026: “If Mothers Raise Children with the Values of Hazrat Ismail (AS), Society Can Be Freed from Every Evil Mothers’ Resolve on Eid-ul-Adha”

Human Aid Society organized a unique, emotional, and awareness-oriented program titled “A Mother’s Fight Against Drugs” on 22nd May 2026 (4th Zil Hajj) at its Head Office, Dewan Bagh Baramulla, ahead of Eid-ul-Adha. The program exclusively invited mothers and was held as part of the “100-Day Anti-Drug Campaign” launched across Jammu & Kashmir by the Hon’ble Lieutenant Governor of Jammu & Kashmir, Manoj Sinha, aimed at creating awareness among families and youth against the growing menace of drug abuse.



During the program, participating mothers were informed in detail about the objectives and importance of the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor's campaign. The mothers collectively pledged that they would provide their children with strong moral, social, and ethical guidance so that the younger generation could be protected from drugs, social evils, and moral decline. They also resolved to create awareness within their homes and communities to help eradicate the dangerous threat of substance abuse from society.

On the occasion, Bashir Ahmad Mir administered an oath to the mothers and stated that when a mother fulfills the responsibility bestowed upon her by Almighty Allah with sincerity and dedication, she has the power to transform society. Referring to the spirit of Eid-ul-Adha, he said that this sacred occasion teaches humanity the true meaning of sacrifice. He added that just as Hazrat Ismail (AS) offered the greatest example of obedience and sacrifice for the sake of Allah, today mothers must pledge to raise their children with the same values of faith, discipline, respect, and righteousness.



He further stated that Eid-ul-Adha should not only be celebrated as a festival, but also observed as a commitment to awaken society against social evils. He urged mothers to rise against the growing menace of drugs and other destructive influences and to actively struggle for building a morally strong and responsible generation. He emphasized that if mothers stand united with awareness and determination, society can defeat every evil threatening the future of the younger generation.

The program was graced by former Principal of Government Women's Degree College Baramulla, renowned psychologist, and PhD Scholar Dr. Neelofar Butt as the Chief Guest.

She spoke extensively about the role and responsibilities of a mother and highlighted the importance of emotional and moral upbringing in shaping responsible children.

In addition, Former Police Drug De-Addiction Centre In-charge Baramulla, Syed Mohamad Altaf Qureshi, as the Guest of Honor informed the mothers about how young boys and girls become involved in substance abuse, the early warning signs of addiction, and how parents especially mothers, can monitor and protect their children from falling victim to this devastating menace.

Renowned social-political activist and former Secretary of Human Aid Society, Naseer Ahmad Rather, also addressed the gathering and stated that when a mother awakens to her responsibility, an entire society can be reformed. Speakers at the event highly appreciated this unique initiative by the organization, noting that it was perhaps the first program of its kind where only mothers were invited and empowered to play a leading role in combating social evils.

At the conclusion of the program, all speakers and participants reaffirmed their commitment to continue the struggle against drugs and other social evils and pledged full cooperation in building a safe, dignified, and healthy society.
