Construction of the Skill Development Centre (Mini ITI)



The **Skill Development Centre** cum HAS Office Complex (Mini ITI) is a major ongoing project of the organization, valued at ₹7.63 crore, including ₹1 crore worth of land donated by the Chairman and ₹6.63 crore in construction costs. The project aims to equip youth with vocational and technical skills, enhancing employment opportunities and promoting self-reliance. After nearly 27 years of dedicated community service, the organization has reached the capacity to undertake large-scale infrastructure and capacity-building projects. The commencement of construction marks a significant milestone, reflecting its continued commitment to youth empowerment and the socio-economic development of the region. Upon completion, the centre will serve as a hub for vocational training, enabling young people to acquire industry-relevant skills and secure sustainable livelihoods.

Student Counselling and Career Guidance Session



10 June 2026, the organization conducted a counselling session for students supported under its educational sponsorship programme. Believing that youth are the foundation of a progressive society, the session aimed to provide guidance, encouragement, and a platform for meaningful interaction.

The session was facilitated by Ms. Iyman Naseer Rather, an intern with the organization and a student at Manipal University. Students actively discussed their academic goals, career aspirations, hobbies, personal interests, and other aspects of their overall development.

The session was well received and successfully fostered open communication, boosted students' confidence, and encouraged informed educational and career decisions.

House Handover to a Woman-Headed Family



Rehabilitation, Poultry Units, Annual Report

13 June 2026, Human Aid Society (HAS) organized a humanitarian programme in the border villages of Baghroto and Busgran, Uri, in the presence of Brigadier K. M. Nithin Kuttappa, Commander, 12 Infantry Brigade.

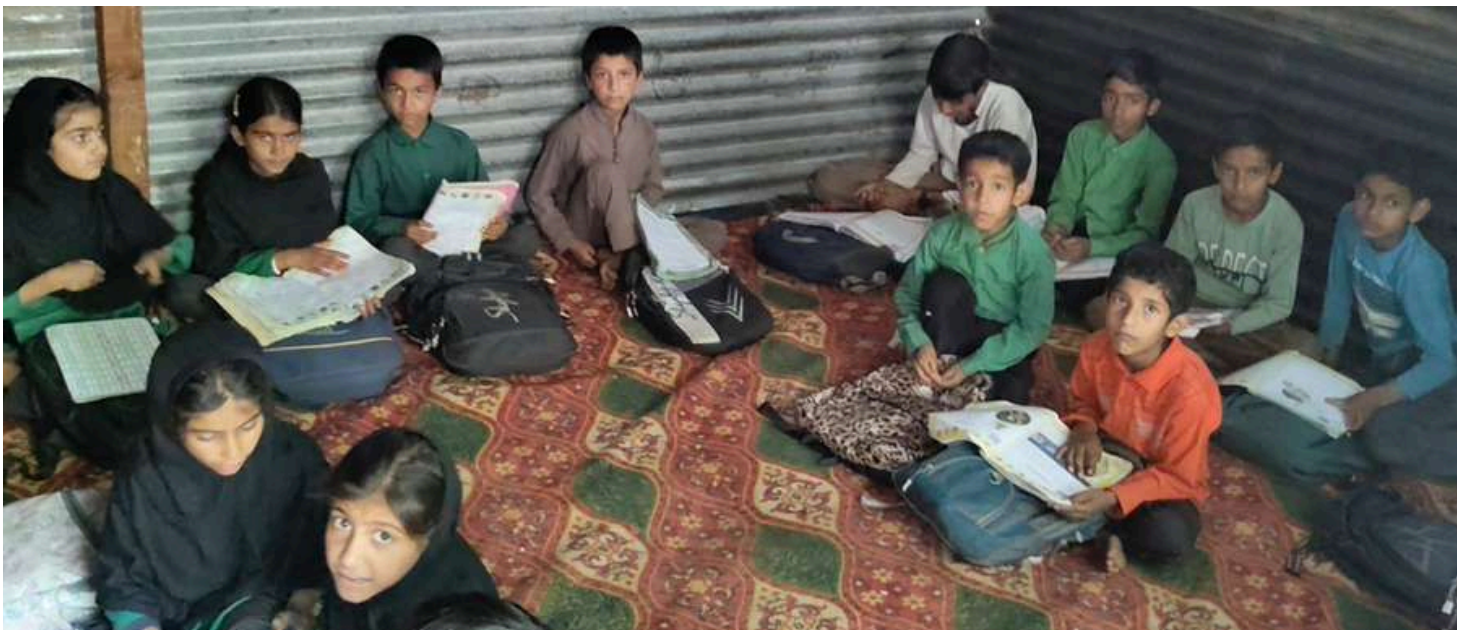
The programme included the handover of a newly constructed house to a vulnerable family in Baghroto whose previous home had become uninhabitable. Built entirely through HAS's mobilized resources, the house provides the family with safe and dignified living conditions.

In Busgran, mini **Poultry Livelihood Units** were inaugurated under HAS's Livelihood Programme in collaboration with Indian Development Service (IDS), Chicago, USA, supporting 25 families with sustainable income-generating opportunities.

The event also marked the release of the Human Aid Society **Annual Report 2025–26**, highlighting the organization's humanitarian, educational, rehabilitation, and community development initiatives. A presentation on HAS's interventions in Uri, particularly its rehabilitation efforts following Operation Sindoor, was delivered by intern Ms. Iyman Naseer.

The programme was attended by community members, local dignitaries, volunteers, and Army officials, who appreciated HAS's continued commitment to supporting vulnerable communities and promoting sustainable development in border areas.

Advocacy and Public Awareness



HASK - 13th June 2026,

Human Aid Society highlighted the poor condition of educational infrastructure in Bagratoo (Dachi), Uri, where students from five classes and their teachers continue to study in a single temporary tin shed under harsh summer conditions. The organization stressed the urgent need for a safe and dignified learning environment.

Bagratoo, affected by past earthquakes and the recent Operation Sindoor, received assistance for damaged homes, but its educational infrastructure remains neglected. HAS also highlighted several school buildings constructed under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan before 2019 that remain unused despite significant public investment, while schools in need continue to lack basic facilities. Many of these buildings have reportedly deteriorated due to prolonged neglect.

The organization called for a transparent inquiry into the non-utilization of these buildings and urged that resources be directed where they are most needed. In the interest of children's education and welfare, HAS appealed to Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor Shri Manoj Sinha, Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Omar Abdullah, Education Minister Ms. Sakina Itoo, Chief Secretary Shri Atal Dulloo, and the Deputy Commissioner of Baramulla to take immediate corrective measures and ensure equitable development of educational infrastructure in the region.

NGO Networking and Collaborative Dialogue



20 June 2026, Human Aid Society hosted representatives of NGOs affiliated with ISD Networking Kashmir to strengthen partnerships, promote mutual learning, and enhance collaborative community development. The delegation, led by Ms. Sadaf, Programme Coordinator of ISD Network Delhi, included representatives from NGOs across West, North, and Central Kashmir. The Chairman, Vice Chairman, former General Secretary, and staff welcomed the delegation. During the visit, Ms. Iyman Naseer presented the organization's achievements over the past two years and its upcoming projects, which were well received by the participants. Discussions emphasized preserving culture and language alongside addressing social and developmental challenges, highlighting language as a key element of cultural identity and heritage. Participants stressed the need to translate discussions into collaborative action through cultural festivals, awareness programmes, and children's activities. The delegates toured the office, observed ongoing initiatives, appreciated HAS's contribution to community welfare, and concluded the meeting with a shared commitment to strengthening cooperation and creating lasting social impact.

Strengthening Bonds and Community Engagement



June 2026, former Deputy Commissioner Baramulla, Mr. Ghulam Ahmad Khawaja, visited the office of Human Aid Society following his arrival from Jammu. Earlier, he paid a condolence visit to the residence of patron of HAS, Haji Karamat Qayoom at Khawaja Bagh and expressed his sympathies with the bereaved family on the demise of a close family member. Accompanied by Mr. Abdul Rashid Parray, former Commissioner Secretary, Mr. Khawaja later interacted with long-time friends and associates at the Human Aid Society office. On the occasion, he appreciated the organization for providing a platform that enables old friends and colleagues to reconnect, exchange views, and strengthen mutual bonds, and thanked the Society for its continued goodwill and community engagement.



22 June 2026, in continuation of Muslim Aid Australia (MAA) collaboration, Human Aid Society successfully completed the half yearly distribution for 2026 under its Annual Grocery Support Programme for widows. As part of the initiative, identified widow-headed households received their monthly grocery assistance through designated distribution points arranged by the organization.

The programme continues to support vulnerable women in meeting essential household food needs while ensuring dignity, accessibility, and transparency in the distribution process. The June distribution was carried out smoothly and was positively received by the beneficiaries, reflecting the continued impact of the partnership between Human Aid Society and Muslim Aid Australia in addressing food insecurity among vulnerable families.

Qualified Youth Dairy Entrepreneurship Initiative for Sustainable Livelihoods



Interview

16 June 2026, Human Aid Society conducted a counselling session for qualified youth interested in dairy-based enterprises as a sustainable livelihood opportunity. Attended by the Chairman and Vice Chairman, the session guided participants on the programme's guidelines, employment and livelihood opportunities, eligibility criteria, and beneficiary selection process, encouraging self-employment through dairy entrepreneurship.

24 June 2026, to ensure transparency and accountability, Human Aid Society facilitated an online screening interview for the applicants, conducted by Mr. Raas Masood, the Project Director of RRAI-USA. Five applicants were jointly selected by Human Aid Society and RRAI-USA, while one aspirant was disqualified by the interview board.

RRAI-USA subsequently requested the identification of five additional deserving beneficiaries. The initiative reflects Human Aid Society's commitment to transparent beneficiary selection and promoting dairy entrepreneurship as a sustainable livelihood opportunity for qualified youth.

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
