WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY “Cleanliness is part of faith”

5th June 2023: On this World Environment Day Human Aid Society (HAS) organised awareness rally cum sanitation drive programme at a newly identified tourist place of **SRANZ FALL** (Bandibala kindi) in collaboration with KDF-UK **Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan** ((NYK) **Department of Education**, Human Aid Society **VTEDS project aspirants**, local inhabitants and the PRIs of village Bandibala, Nagbal, Nilsar and Dandmooha. On this occasion Chairman of Human Aid Society Bashir Ah Mir highlighted the importance of world environment day concept and urged that every year 5th June is celebrated as World Environmental day across the world, and on this day, governments, people, and non-governmental organizations join hands together and aware the people to keep the environment around them clean and transparent, and through by the various methods they try to convince the people that how important cleanliness is for human beings, animals, plants and birds are.

Chairman (HAS) Said that nowadays, if we look at the environment around us, we can see huge piles of dirt on the banks of rivers, springs, fields, barns as well as in the public places, The smell from the dirt not only pollutes our environment but also affects our life and the plants growing around us. He urged the people to contribute to the environment in order to save it from pollution, he requested the local villagers living around the said place (**SRANZ FALL**) that your attention to this natural beauty place should be mandatory because this place can also provide employment opportunities to your area provided you people took a special attention towards it.

Chairman Human Aid Society also told that though this place falls foothills of world-famous tourist place **Gulmarg** but due to the negligence and poor response of Tourism Department this place has failed to attain the status for which the place was known.



Mr Mir emphasized to the members of concerned local Panchayat Committees that whatever funds you get from the government for cleaning up your villages, you can save some of the fund and spend it in this area, because it is located in the vicinity of your villages. He said that today as we found our youths are deeply involved in using of Narcotics and or involving themselves in other social evils so it is your responsibility to take special care of this place, because due to the arrival of these wrong elements, not only the rush of tourists here may decrease, but at the same time, its beauty may also be tarnished. He requested the Concerned SHO police station Chandoosa Mr Irfan Ali who was also the part of this awareness cum sanitation drive programme to keep a special eye on this tourist sport so that these wrong elements are stopped from here in any case, who come here and spoil our peaceful environment here.

A local Panchayat Head Mr Abdul Hameed said that although tourists from the country or outside the country are rarely seen here, but people from all over Kashmir come here in thousands every day to enjoy this natural beauty which indicates its importance. Though many people are amazed by the beauty of this place every day, but it is worth mentioning here that we strongly oppose the neglect of this place by the tourism department, but we also have to admit that the local people who come here for sightseeing also do not hesitate to turn it into a pile of dirt instead of spoiling its beauty and said that not only the beauty of this place becomes colourless, but also the clean and transparent water of the **famous NALA NINGLIE** passing through it would have become polluted and become a cause of various diseases for the people of the whole area. He said on behalf of my area we appreciated the role of Human Aid Society and its collaborating partners for chosen this place on today's world environment day and somehow restore its Natural Glory.



GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL MEETINGS:

MNGO MEETING WITH ONE STOP CENTER BARAMULLA:

15th JUNE 2023: NGOs can play a vital role to stop the violence against women. Sakhi One Stop Center Baramulla has organized a one-day long awareness programme in regard to aware the Local NGOs about the primary concerns of One Stop Center as it was established in Baramulla in the month of August 2022. Under the leadership of Deputy Commissioner Baramulla. The programme was organized at the head office of Human Aid Society who is also the Mother NGO for the District.

The awareness programme was chaired by the Ex-Principal GDC Baramulla Prof. Mohammad Ismail who is also the Chairman of PET Welfare Society.

The Secretary Human Aid Society Mr Naseer Ahmad Rather briefed the NGO representatives about their role and responsibilities in regard to curb the violence against the women folk.

The District Coordinator Sakhi One Stop Center Baramulla Ms Bushra Beidar told the NGOs that One Stop Center Baramulla has registered 290 cases against various types of violences as faced by the women and out of which one hundred and seventy (170) cases were resolved through mutual consultations. Ms Bushra Beidar requested all the NGOs to come forward and help One Stop Center authorities in curbing the domestic violence as well as the violence that women are facing in offices and other workplaces. Getting people's support is an important task, so we have urged people everywhere to come forward and help us in reducing the violence against women as she said.



All the NGO representatives participating in this programme had pledged to give their full support to the One Stop Center Baramulla and in this regard, they also put some valuable suggestions before the District Coordinator. Prof. Mohammad Ismail, who presided over the programme thanked all the NGOs and said that all these NGOs will prepare a written vision document in order to end violence against women, He also added that it is our moral and social responsibility to send our suggestions in a written form to the concerned District Chairman One Stop Center (DC Baramulla) and convince the district authorities that all the NGOs are ready to work together against the oppression and violence against women and we promise to walk side by side with the government at every step.

Human Aid Society reaches out with humanitarian relief to frontier Ring Payeen village of Machil Sector of Kupwara district. As part of the ongoing ZERO HUNGER Programme aimed at assisting the poor and needy in frontier villages, the Human Aid Society (HAS) collaborated with the ILTIZAM Relief Society to extend its relief operation to the border village of Ring Payeen in Machil Sector, Kupwara district. The distribution team, led by Chairman of HAS, Bashir Ahmad Mir, successfully distributed food kits to the impoverished families in the village.

The team distributed food kits to the poor and needy families in Ring Payeen and its adjoining villages, which is located 14 kilometers away from Machil. INTRODUCTION:

Human Aid Society, in collaboration with KDF-UK, has been performing the religious ritual of Qurbani for the past four years. The aim is to provide meat packs to the doorsteps of the needy who are unable to arrange nutritional food for their children.

PREPARATIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS:

Human Aid Society organized a meeting at its head office on 26 June before the Qurbani for the Tehsil representatives. During this meeting, Chairman and General Secretary provided instructions to the volunteers regarding the ongoing Qurbani process.

IMPLEMENTATION OF QURBANI:

Human Aid Society (HAS) and KDF-UK carry out the Qurbani in 12 far-flung villages of border District Baramulla. To oversee the overall activities, HAS designated three teams:

TEAM1: led by Assistant Secretary Mr. Reyaz Ahmad Ganai, included Syed Fayaz Bukhari, Abdul Hameed Ganai (Sarpanch) and Mushtaq Ah Mir. This team supervised the Qurbani activities in village Goriwan (Narwav), Hajibal Baramulla, and Kandi Dandmooha and Takya Yousuf Shah of BabaReshi area.

TEAM 2: led by Riyaz Ah War, was accompanied by Manzoor Ah and Mohmad Younis Khan, overseeing the Qurbani activity in village Check Kchadari/Zehenpora, Zamboor Pattan and Hakapathry Pehlipora of Boniyaar tehsil.

TEAM3: led by Mohammad Ashraf Dar, included Mohammad Ashraf Mir and Mohammad Saleem Mir, responsible for village Hamam Markoot, Kangroosa, Dalri, Dogripora and Tingalpura of Rafiabad area.



VOLUNTEERS DEDICATION:
